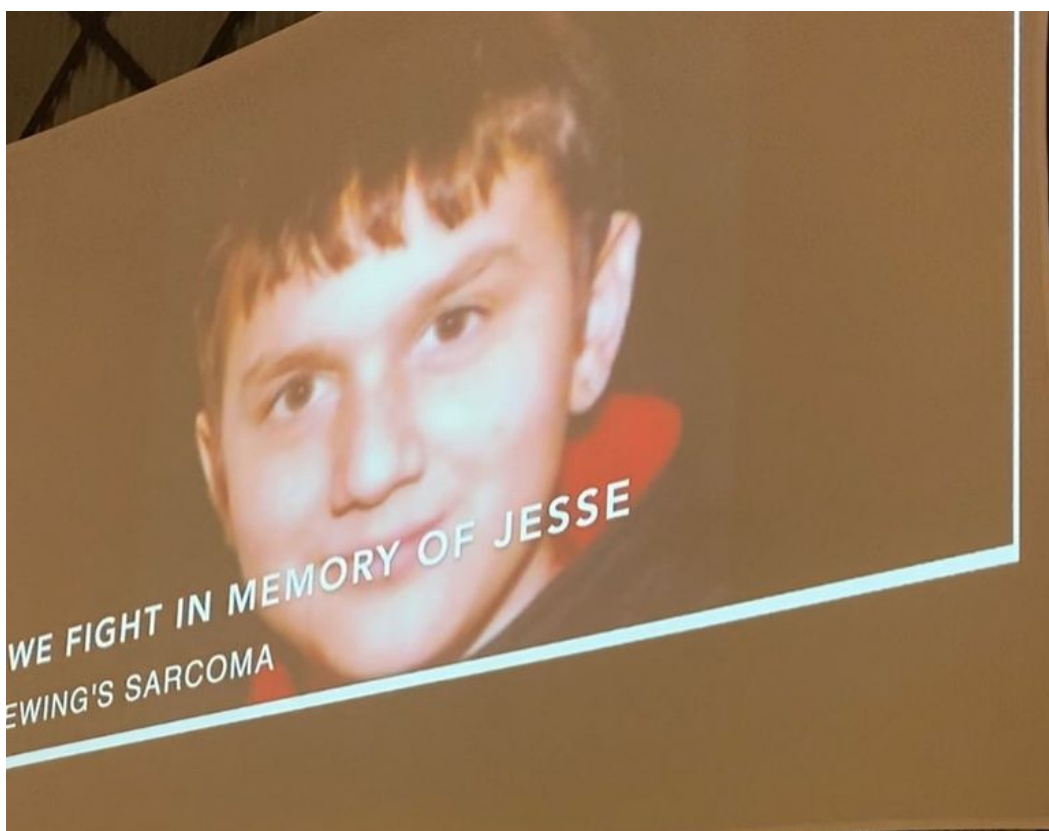
Spring 2022 Newsletter
